Admissions Requirements



Who is a good fit for MICC?

- Between the ages of 18-26 years old at the start of the program.
- A diagnosed learning difference, autism spectrum disorder, or other neurological diagnoses.
- Full Scale IQ of 70 or above based on a neuropsychological evaluation completed within the last 2 years.
- Possess a desire to live independently.
- Be able to make independent, safe decisions and not require 24-hour supervision.
- Have evidence of their ability to navigate day-to-day activities (school, volunteering, work, etc.) without 1:1 support.



Admissions Process.

- **1. Tour campus** virtual 1:1 with admissions
- 2. Apply online (\$100 application fee)
- 3. Required materials secure portal
- Neuropsychological evaluation from the last 2 years
- Educational transcripts
- 3 recommendations
- Vocational support documents (if applicable)
- Guardianship information (if applicable)
- 4. Virtual interview



Program Costs & Financial Assistance



Financial Assistance.

- MICC awards a limited amount of **need-based financial assistance** each year, with a maximum award of 50% of tuition covered.
- Students with state or county funding may be able to use portions of their funding to offset tuition costs. In Minnesota, individuals can use CDCS Services, and Wisconsin residents can use IRIS funds. For information about other states, please contact admissions at 612.876.9409.
- Participation in MICC College may qualify as a <u>medical tax deduction</u>. Consult with your tax advisor.
- Alternate forms of funding sources may be accepted at MICC including SSI or 529A Plan funds.
- MICC does not qualify for any Federal Financial Aid.



College Program Costs.

Tuition fees include:

- all instruction, books and instructional materials
- participation in classes, activities, and electives
- staff supports (1:4 to 1:12 based upon curriculum, staff:student ratio)
- Transportation

Total tuition for the 2020-2021 MICC College school year is \$50,830 (MN Resident) and \$53,788 (Non-Minnesota Resident)

Room & Board includes:

- a furnished apartment and utilities
- groceries
- Southdale YMCA access

Room & Board for the 2020-2021 MICC College school year is \$7,650 (MN and Non-Minnesota Residents).
