 - Purchase agreement to buy the old Duluth News Tribune building. After remodel, we would like to move programs that are correctly renting spaces to this building. Duluth will be saving money by purchasing this building.
 - There were 4 new teachers that attended the new teacher training for this school year. Had to offer another training for an additional 7-8 new teachers. 50% turnover in the special services department along with the clerical area.
